Objectives:

Students will identify how they can reduce their holiday waste at home. Students will persuade their families in a letter to implement waste reducing methods at home.

Materials Needed:

Paper Pencil 2 articles Trash Talk newsletter

Procedure:

Students should read both articles by the EPA, as well as the Trash Talk newsletter. Students should write a persuasive letter to their families about how they can reduce holiday waste. The letter must address:

1) ways to reduce holiday waste

2) why reducing waste is important

3) ideas students can implement at home

The letter must be properly formatted, be persuasive in nature, and at least 1 - 1.5 pages in length.

Closing Activity:

Have students proofread each other's letters when finished. Have students brainstorm and discuss with one another other ways they can reduce waste in their homes.
